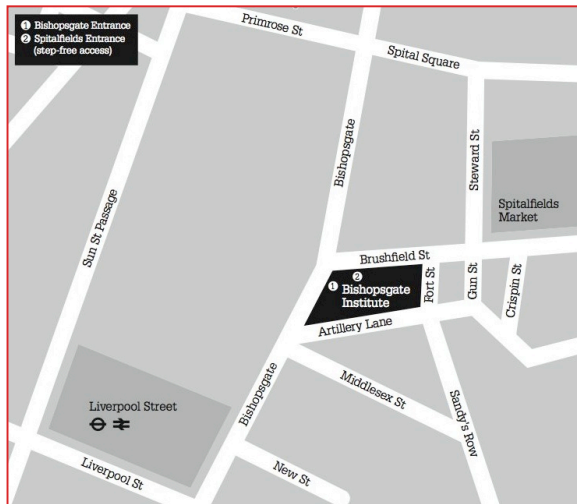

Getting there:

By Underground/Rail

Liverpool Street underground (Central, Circle, Hammersmith & City and Metropolitan lines) and mainline stations, as well as Shoreditch High Street station (London Overground).

By Bus

A large number of buses serve the Bishopsgate area: 8, 26, 35, 42, 47, 78, 149, 242, 344 and 388.

By Bicycle

A docking station for 'Boris Bikes' is situated directly outside the Institute on Brushfield Street. Public bicycle racks can be found on Bishopsgate.

By Car/Motorbike

Bishopsgate Institute falls within the Congestion Charge Zone and parking is severely limited in the area so we recommend you use public transport.

There are a limited number of parking spaces for Blue Badge holders on Brushfield Street.

Parking meters are generally in operation in the streets surrounding the Institute.

The nearest car park is at 15 White's Row, Spitalfields.

Access
